### **Police Chiefs Award Prestigious Joe Molloy Award to Ripon Police Chief Richard Bull**

CPCA Outgoing-President Jerry Dyer, chief of police in Fresno, presented Chief Bull with the award for his dedication and service to law enforcement and to the California Police Chiefs Association. This award embodies the characteristics represented by the late Chief Joe Molloy of Anaheim, of professionalism, leadership, energy, and commitment to the mission of the Association.
